

2015-2016 Community Influenza Surveillance Report Update of Current Status April 5, 2016

Overall assessment

Influenza activity in Middlesex-London is ongoing, although the number of reported cases is lower compared to the previous reporting week.

Current Local Activity

From March 27th to April 2nd, 2016, there were 33 laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza (17 influenza A and 16 influenza B) reported to the Middlesex-London Health Unit, of whom 14 were hospitalized. Since September 1st, 2015, there has been a total of 405 laboratory-confirmed influenza cases (305 influenza A, 99 influenza B, one influenza A & B co-infection) reported in London and Middlesex County. The Health Unit was also advised of three deaths during this past reporting week in people with laboratory-confirmed influenza. Two outbreaks due to influenza (one influenza A and one influenza B) were declared in long term care homes during this reporting period.

Appendix A provides more details about laboratory-based influenza activity indicators, as well as other local indicators of respiratory illness. A graph showing all 405 laboratory-confirmed cases by week is provided in Appendix B, at the end of this report.


